

## HUMAN TRAFFICKING RESOURCES

A few signs to be aware of include:

- Evidence of being controlled by another person either physically or psychologically
- Apparent inability to move or leave job
- Poor working conditions
- Overly dependent or fearful of boss, spouse or others around
- Fear or depression
- Non-English speaking or not allowed to speak to customers
- Recently entered U.S. from Eastern Europe, Asia, Latin America, Canada, Africa or India
- Observe nonverbal behavior: posture, facial expressions and tone of voice
- Does the victim possess or control their identification documentation?
- Red Flag is if a victim does not speak for him or herself

Don't be silent! Spread the word: slavery is here, now, but not to stay, if we all do our part:

- Know how to identify a victim/criminal
- Know who to call
- Join "Traffick Free Pomona" by calling 909-629-5277 ext 3014
- Mentor teens through churches, Boys and Girls Clubs, etc.
- Protect children and teens online – one in seven are solicited for sex online.
- Do not patronize adult industries
- Encourage police & government officials to work on this issue in your community
- Advocate for stronger laws, better training and enforcement
- Tell others about the crime as much as possible
- Organize awareness campaigns through your church, neighborhoods, service club, social groups
